

"This will be a sign to you...The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Emmanuel." Isaiah 7:14

Many people in our society seem to have no place for or faith in God. For many the idea of God is put into the same box as Father Christmas or the Easter Bunny. Why? Well there are many reasons. For some it doesn't seem logical, for others it seems too fantastical, and still others would say faith seems to have done more harm than good in the world. The end result is that many people just don't feel that God is relevant to real life. Perhaps it's because the story has been so sanitized and romanticized that it no longer reflects the reality of what really happened.



Perhaps it has been so used and abused that people feel it can no longer be trusted.

The Christmas story reminds us of the transcendent God, the one beyond all human capacity to define or describe, who works in our world through real people with real challenges. He didn't choose a fairy-tale princess to bear the saviour, but rather an unwed peasant girl. He didn't choose a political or business success story to name and care for Jesus, but rather a man with his own doubts and questions who wanted to do the right thing but needed angelic guidance to accomplish it. He didn't choose a nice safe and clean private hospital, but rather a smelly cold stable for animals. He didn't choose the powerful and influential to be the first to know about the birth of Christ, but rather those on the bottom of the social ladder, insignificant and probably illiterate farm hands. All of this helps flesh out the name "Emmanuel", "God with us." Or "God REALLY with us." That is, God coming to be with us as we are. Not as we know we should be, or are trying to be, or have

promised to be, or will be some day, but with us as we are now...today...in this moment. This is the promise at the heart of the Christmas story – that as God came before to be with, use, accept, and hallow Joseph and Mary at the birth of Christ, so also God comes to us in Christ to be with us, use us for good, accept us as we are, and redeem us by God's own presence. Yes, God is really with us! Yes, God is with us, really and truly as we are. Yes, this is our faith and our hope. This is the Christmas promise.

May you discover Emmanuel this Christmas.

commitments. The Church Wardens, Vestry and other Church Leaders have also been an instrumental part in enabling the smooth running of the Church and it is with pride that we continue to promote and celebrate this team approach.

It is this kind of team approach that Dallas Moore stepped in to take over the running of the Wednesday morning communion as Rev Lance Kevey was unable to take this service for a period of time. We thank God for Rev Kevey being able to resume this service recently. With the opening up of the rest homes, Rev Jeff Roberts has taken up the mantle of running monthly Rest Home services at Fergusson and Summerset. These have been well received and the numbers continue to grow. He also leads a monthly service

at Summerset Village.

We have also trained up our Liturgical

Assistants to be able to administer the reserve sacrament which has enabled us to still have communion when none of the above Priests have been available. This has been a wonderful opportunity to share our ministry giftings and build our leadership team.

The partnership with Mahinga Kai has

enabled us to share our community garden and grow vegetables that will help feed those that most need it.
